## Don't Forget Our Community Dinners!

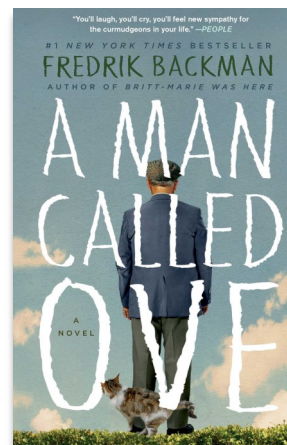
